ADVISORY FOR CHARTERED FLIGHTS FROM MALAYSIA TO INDIA

The Government of India will be allowing chartered flights to operate with effect from 15 October 2021 from Malaysia to destinations in India. In addition to the existing permission for foreign nationals to travel to India, **holders of tourist visa are also allowed to travel**. While individual travellers on tourist visa can avail this facility from 15 November 2021, tourists travelling by chartered flights can undertake the journey commencing 15 October 2021. The procedure for operating Chartered flights from Malaysia is reiterated as under:-

- Chartering entity identifies an ATO and provides details of passengers, destination and manifest.
- ATO contacts State Government directly; shares a copy of the proposal and passenger manifest with State Government (destination State) and the High Commission of India in Kuala Lumpur.
- State Government will check internally for quarantine availability etc. In parallel, the High Commission of India in Kuala Lumpur would verify the passenger list and upload to the MEA repatriation portal.
- ATO contacts DGCA for flight clearance with State Government's written clearance for the flight and High Commission of India's 'no-objection' on the manifest.
- Where needed, Indian ATOs can seek for help from High Commission of India in Kuala Lumpur, for obtaining Government of Malaysia's clearances, based on State Government's written approval.
- Prior to the actual departure of the flight, ATO sends the Indian high Commission, and State Governments the final manifest.

on the online Air Suvidha portal (www.newdelhiairport.in) before the scheduled travel and upload a negative COVID-19 RT-PCR report which should have been conducted within 72 hrs prior to undertaking the journey. Passengers seeking exemption may apply online on www.newdelhiairport.in.

The ATO, Charter operators and passengers are also required to refer to State-specific protocols, on the state specific official websites to be well informed about any additional requirements. All passengers departing from Malaysian airports are advised to **follow theguidelines** stipulated by the Govt of Malaysia & **get their Visa/Pass regularised from the Immigration Office** in Malaysia, where required.
