India's Participation at COP-28 Summit in Dubai, UAE

Hon'ble PM of India, Shri Narendra Modi participated in the World Climate Action Summit:

Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi participated in the World Climate Action Summit, which is High-Level Segment of the 28th Conference of Parties (COP-28) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), in Dubai, UAE from 30 November- 1 December 2023. Hon'ble PM participated in the COP-28 Presidency's Session on "Transforming Climate Finance" on 1 December 2023. The event focussed on making climate finance more available, accessible, and affordable to developing countries and urged developed countries to completely reduce carbon footprint intensity by 2050. On the sidelines of COP-28 Summit, Hon'ble Prime Minister launched LeadIT 2.0, with a focus on inclusive and just industry transition, co-development and transfer of low-carbon technology and financial assistance to emerging economies. Climate change has been an important priority area of India's G20 Presidency, and significant new steps have been captured in the New Delhi Leaders' Declaration and other outcomes during India's G-20 Presidency.

Kuala Lumpur on 1 December 2023, together with Deputy Minister, Senator Mrs. Saraswathy Kandasami and Dr Rajkumar Ranjan Singh, Hon'ble Minister of State for External Affairs and Education and Presidents of GOPIO Malaysia and GOPIO International. He commended GOPIO Malaysia and GOPIO International for the inaugural business summit which provided a unique opportunity for Malaysian and Indian companies to leverage economic and growth opportunities in both countries.

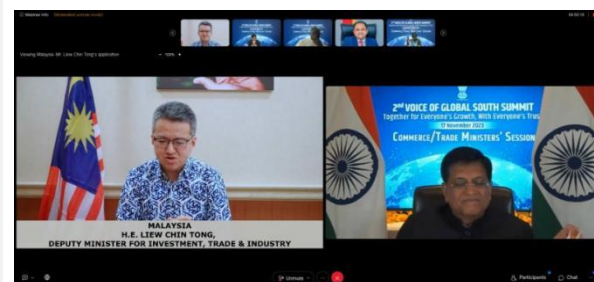

Deputy Minister Yusof bin Apdal highlighted the need for creating a strategic work force with adequate skills to meet the demands of future industry. Higher Education collaboration including skilling and TVET plays an increasingly important role in India – Malaysia Enhanced Strategic Partnership. **Mr. Liew Chin Tong , Deputy Minister of Investment, Trade and Industry of Malaysia joined the Commerce Session of the Summit on 17 November.**



Malaysia also took part in the first edition of the Summit in January 2023 with the participation of Malaysian Minister of Trade and Investment, Mr. Zafrul. 1. **WHO and the Ministry of Ayush signed the Traditional and Complementary Medicine 'Project Collaboration Agreement'**

Spotlight and Opportunities in India

Ports Industry



- India has 12 major and 200+ notified minor and intermediate ports. The Indian ports and shipping industry play a vital role in sustaining growth in the country's trade and commerce. India is the sixteenth-largest maritime country in the world with a coastline of 7,516.6 kms.
- According to the Ministry of Shipping, around 95% of India's trading by volume and 70% by value is done through maritime transport. The Indian Government plays an important role in supporting the ports sector. It has allowed Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) of up to 100% under the automatic route for port and harbour construction and maintenance projects. It has also facilitated a 10-year tax holiday to enterprises that develop, maintain, and operate ports, inland waterways, and inland ports.
- India's Increasing investment and cargo traffic point towards a healthy outlook for the Indian ports sector. Providers of services such as operation and maintenance (O&M), pilotage and harbouring and marine assets such as barges and dredgers are benefiting from these investments. The capacity addition at ports is expected to grow at a CAGR of 5-6% till 2022, thereby adding 275-325 MT of capacity. India has plans to invest US\$ 82 billion in port projects by 2035.
- The Domestic waterways have found to be a cost-effective and environmentally sustainable mode of freight transportation. The government aims to operationalise 23 waterways by 2030. As part of the Sagarmala project, more than 574 projects worth US\$ 82 billion have been planned for implementation between 2015 and 2035.
- The Global Maritime India Summit 2023 serve as a platform to showcase global best practices, foster investment partnerships and chart a new and bright course for our collective future.
