The Mission manages bilateral relations, provides consular services, and serves as a key point of engagement with the large community of Personnas of Indian Origin (PIO) in Malaysia.</p> <p>Our vision is to foster strong and mutually beneficial relations between India and Malaysia promoting bilateral cooperation. The High Commission of India, Kuala Lumpur aims to be a trusted partner, working towards shared prosperity, peace and sustainable development with Malaysia.
