Rashtriya Raksha University's Resident Scholarship

Rashtriya Raksha University (RRU) <www.rru.ac.in>, is the National Defence University of India, and an Institution of National Importance – pioneering national security and police.

2. As part of its global outreach initiative, RRU is planning to develop strong bilateral relations with partner countries to develop people-to-people contact in the field of academic, research and training excellence in the domain of security, police, strategic and defence education, research and training through its qualified civilian, military and police faculty.

3. RRU is inviting nomination of distinguished scholars from reputed Universities / think-tanks in Malaysia to pursue academic courses at RRU and join as *Resident Scholar for minimum 8 weeks to maximum 6 months*. It can be for a longer period also.

4. **Desired qualification(s) and experience:** Persons who have served government / semi-government departments/agencies including retired senior officers from relevant ministry; in case of academic/research institutions, persons with minimum master degree in the relevant field with 8 years of experience; persons holding PhD degree may be given preference; female scholars are encouraged to apply.

5. The Resident Scholar will conduct academic, research and training courses, seminars and similar activities for the RRU and RRU sponsored / assigned projects and programs in the following fields:

1. History and Geography
2. Foreign Policy and Internal Security Interests, Needs and Concerns of Malaysia vis-à-vis India
3. Major Internal Security and Economic Issues and Challenges of Malaysia
4. Key Actors and Institutions outside the classical Government Model in Malaysia
5. Economic, Finance, Trade and Commerce – Future Projections, especially in Post COVID-19 scenario
6. Research-Technological Developments in security field in Malaysia
7. Evolving Socio-Cultural-Religious Trends in Malaysia
8. Legislative, Judiciary and Governmental Developments and Reforms in Malaysia
9. Innovating Relationship – Myths, Perception, Facts: Education, Sports and Media in Malaysia

6. The Scholar can conduct research together with like-minded faculty and students from RRU and external institutions; organize training programs raising awareness among stakeholders on particular issues and challenges; provide certificate 14-hours (1 credit course) on particular subject, among others.

7. The Resident Scholar will be paid economic round-trip airfare (one time), monthly scholarship of USD 1000 or equivalent, and free lodging facilities at RRU. The Scholar will be provided with office space, library access and will be associated with one of the 11 Schools of the University.
