He emphasized that such cultural exchanges play a pivotal role in strengthening people-to-people bonds and fostering mutual understanding between the two regions. Bharat Club has been an important platform for Indian expats to celebrate and preserve Indian roots and to promote various facets of Indian culture, art, music, dance, cuisine, textiles, philosophy, and yoga in Malaysia. Over the decades, Bharat Club has actively partnered with the Mission in its outreach activities.Mr. N Murali, President Bharat Club KL and Mrs Madhavi Murali, President of the Ladies Wing of Bharat Club KL were felicitated by the High Commission on the occasion.

The cultural programme featured a diverse range of performances, including **Joget Dance** (a lively traditional Malaysian dance), **Coconut Dance** (representing Cambodia's cultural identity and community spirit), **Bamboo Dance** (performed across India's Northeast and in Thailand, Myanmar, the Philippines, Laos, Malaysia, Vietnam, Cambodia, and Indonesia), a dramatic retelling of a timeless tale from the **epic Ramayana**, and a vibrant **costume show** celebrating India's incredible diversity through a tapestry of tradition and style.

More than 600 guests attended the event, including distinguished Heads of Missions from ASEAN countries and members of the diplomatic community, senior officials from the Government of Malaysia, prominent members of the Indian community in Malaysia, and distinguished members of Bharat Club Kuala Lumpur, along with leaders of community and cultural organizations, and representatives from business and media.
